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SUBJECT: AVMC VISITATION POLICY

REFERENCE(S): California Code of Regulations, TITLE XXII, Sections 70577(k)(1)(c),

70707 (b) (17) and 70709

CMS, Conditions of Participation, 42 CFR, Section 482.13(h) RI.01.01.01, EP28, The Joint Commission, January 1, 2024

PURPOSE: To provide guidelines for visiting patients that promotes patient safety and

healing.

AFFECTED AREAS/DEPARTMENT: All

POLICY:

I. VISITOR EXPECTATIONS:

- A. The hospital <u>reserves the right to impose additional limitations</u> on visitation at any time when it could interfere with the care of the patient or with the safety of others on hospital premises. Reasons for limiting or restricting visitation may include but are not limited to infection control (i.e., flu season), disruptive behavior of visitors, patient need for rest or privacy, civil disturbances, hospital lockdowns, etc. a national, state or local emergency, or an executive decision made by the Hospital Safety Officer or Administrator On-Call in conjunction with the Executive Management Team.
- B. Visitors are not to cause any disruptions to the hospital's healing environment. This includes any conduct that is disruptive, disorderly, or violent.
- C. Visitors that fail to follow the above-enlisted expectations will be asked to leave the premises. When staff are concerned about their own safety and the safety of others due to abusive or assaultive behavior, they should initiate a Code Gray by dialing 3333.

D. Visitation is available at any time.

- i. When the Main Entrance of the hospital **closes from 8:00pm to 5:30am**, the visitors will go to the Emergency Department (ED) entrance to receive their visitor pass and get directions on how to proceed to the inpatient unit the patient is on.
- ii. **2 3 visitors per patient** at a time are allowed. **Small groups** of visitors can wait and rotate in the waiting room outside the unit. **Large groups** of visitors must rotate from the waiting room to outside of the hospital.

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- iii. Nighttime visitation will be limited to 1-2 visitors per patient at a time.
- iv. Visitors wanting to **spend the night** are limited **to 1 (one) visitor per patient** and needs to be respectful when there are other patients in the room. If the visitor is the <u>opposite gender of the patient(s)</u>, the other patient in the room needs to agree to have that visitor remain in the room with the drape drawn. If **not** agreeable, the visitor can visit periodically utilizing the unit waiting room.
- v. Visitors that are under the age of 16 years of age, must be accompanied by an adult: No one under the age of 16 years of age may visit when respiratory season restrictions are in effect. i.e. COVID, FLU, RSV.
- vi. When **not** on seasonal restrictions, **healthy children must be 2 years of age or older** and must be accompanied by an adult. **Limit to 1 (one) child under the age of 16 years old per patient up to thirty (30) minutes for safety and infection control reasons**
- E. Visitors **must register at a Visitor Information Desk to obtain a visitor pass** before being allowed access to patient care units. In the event the main visitor desk is closed, visitors shall enter and register through the Emergency Department.
- F. Visitors are expected to **display their visitor pass at chest level at all times**. Visitors without an appropriate visitor pass will be re-directed to an information desk or asked to leave the premises.
- G. Visitors must wear appropriate attire and shoes at all times.
- H. Visitors are prohibited from smoking, vaping, marijuana use or chewing tobacco on hospital property.
- I. Visitors are prohibited from bringing any contraband items, such as alcohol, drugs, or weapons into the hospital.
- J. Visitors are prohibited from using beds, bathrooms, specialty chairs, or other furnishings provided for patient use due to the possibility of transmission of viruses or infections.
- K. Videography, photography, filming and audio recording of any kind are strictly prohibited unless authorization and consent is properly obtained. See policy RI.3.1 entitled VIDEOGRAPHY, PHOTOGRAPHY, FILMING AND AUDIO

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RECORDING.

- K. Service and Therapy animals are allowed to visit patient's rooms as long as it will not be harmful to patients or interfere with treatment for **short periods of time only and must be accompanied by the visitor at all times**. The animal must be clean, well behaved and managed by the visitor at all times. See Infection Control Manual policy IC.2.22 entitled SERVICE ANIMAL GUIDELINES. See Infection Control Manual policy IC.1 entitled Infection prevention and control Program Plan.
- III. Number of visitors per patient may vary by department. Any exceptions must be approved by the House Supervisor in coordination with the Unit Charge Nurse, Unit Manager/Director and the Security Department. Please see the attachment for specific visitation expectations for specialty units.
- IV. Visitors requesting to visit patients with a **Do Not Announce (DNA) flag** shall not be provided any information. See policy RI.6.2 entitled CONFIDENTIAL REGISTRATIONS. **If visitation is being approved** for a patient with a DNA Flag the visitor will need to display a current I.D. to be viewed by Security prior to receiving a visitor pass.
- V. For patients who have expired, visitors may stay with the patient up to **3.5** hours per CDC guidelines.
- VI. Visitors *may be* asked to wait in the appropriate waiting area when patient care is to be administered or when requested by the patient and/or healthcare staff.
